Requirements

- Must have the Madison CU Mobile App
- · Must be 18 or older
- Must have been a member for at least 90 days
- Must have account in good standing (includes no more than six (6) checks returned for non-sufficient funds (NSF) in the last twelve (12) months, along with less than three (3) returned deposit items in the last twelve (12) months.

Restrictions

 A maximum of \$2500 per check, a total of \$2500 worth of checks per day and \$5000 per month.

- No CD's, DVD's, Floppy Disc's, Hard Drives, Batteries
- No Plastic Sheet Protectors, Hanging File Folders, Binders, Binder Clips,
- No Magazines, Metal Clips, Newspapers,
- · No Credit Cards
